Summary:	SkilledTradesBC Standardized Level Exams (SLE) are being introduced for Harmonized Level 2 of <b>Auto Body and Collision Technician</b> programs.
Details:	Apprentice technical training of <b>Levels 2</b> of <b>Auto Body and Collision Technician</b> that begins after <b>March 1, 2023</b> will be required to sit the SkilledTradesBC Level 2 Exam. The exam will contribute 20% to an apprentice's final mark.
	An Exam Breakdown is available on the trade page for the <u>Auto Body and Collision</u> <u>Technician</u> Level 2 in the box titled, <u>SLE weighting charts.</u> This breakdown shows the number of questions on the exam per General Area of Competency (GAC) and Competency.
Rationale:	SkilledTradesBC implemented Standardized Level Exams as part of an assessment strategy to ensure consistent outcomes at each program level for apprentices throughout BC.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Scheduling Exams:Exams are to be requested by training providers via the usual SkilledTradesBC<br/>procedure. For more information, please see<br/><a href="https://www.skilledtradesbc.ca/training-provider-resources">https://www.skilledtradesbc.ca/training-provider-resources</a>. Training providers are<br/>required to complete a SkilledTradesBC Exam Request Form six to eight weeks prior<br/>to the scheduled exam date. Training providers are encouraged to identify courses<br/>using the Session ID, to aid in confirmation of exam type. SkilledTradesBC will<br/>provide an invigilator for these exams.

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Calculating and Submitting Final Marks for Blended Exams:	<ul> <li>Process</li> <li>SkilledTradesBC administers the exam, records the mark in Direct Access (DA), and reports it to the training provider.</li> <li>The training provider blends the in-school (80%) and SLE (20%) marks to</li> </ul>
	produce a final mark for the level (or as indicated in the Assessment Guidelines).
	• The training provider reports the final, blended mark to SkilledTradesBC and records it in DA.
	<ul> <li>DA reports the final, blended mark to the apprentice as a single percentage score.</li> <li>When the final mark is entered into DA, the system performs a reverse calculation using the SLE mark to determine the in-school mark.</li> <li>All three marks are stored in the apprentice's record, but only the final blended mark is reported on the SkilledTradesBC transcript.</li> <li>A blended mark of 70% or greater is required to pass the level.</li> </ul>
