Authority (ITA) website at http://www.itabc.ca/.

Rationale: Construction Craft Worker (CCW) became BC's 48th designated Red Seal program in June 2014. As part of the implementation plan for the new program, nine training providers were qualified to pilot CCW through fall 2014 and spring 2015.

To address the outcomes of the pilot and the pending publication of a new 2014 National Occupational Analysis (NOA), ITA undertook a review of the CCW program. The review ensured that learnings from the pilot deliveries and alignment to the new NOA were captured in an updated Program Outline.

Details: A Construction Craft Worker Program review was conducted in September 2015 to align the ITA Construction Craft Worker Program to the 2014 NOA (publication pending). The review process revised gaps between the two standards and revised content to current industry standard.

ITA will undertake a review of the Standardized Level Exam (Level 1) in October 2015. Upon completion of the exam revisions, an exam-weighting chart will be published on the Construction Craft Worker page of the ITA website under *Program Updates*.
