- **Flexible apprenticeship program started in 2006**
- **Partnership with Teck Coal and COTR**
- **11 Heavy Duty Equipment Mechanics**
- **11 Industrial Electricians**

Cooperative Program

- **Candidates must have completed Foundation level to apply**
- **Teck and COTR Interview and select candidates**
- **Students rotate to another mine after completing each level**
- **Teck and COTR share supervision**

Considerations

- COTR Department Head is the student supervisor and makes regular site visits to each of the 5 mines in the Elk Valley
